Gamma Kappa Omega Chapter

The first initiation of Gamma Kappa Omega chapter was conducted at the Attucks Grade School on Jackson Street, Carbondale, Illinois on March 15, 1941. Marianna Beck, Alice McGehee Smart and Blanche Patterson McWilliams joined Ms. Roberts in the initiation ceremony. The first Chapter Officers were installed: Lovia B. Penn, President; Gwendolyn Chambliss, Vice President; Versa L. Hayes, Secretary; Lucille Walker, Corresponding Secretary; Velma C. Woods, Treasurer; Mildred Kedley, Sentinel; and Jenolar F. Hillsman McBride, Ivy Leaf Reporter.

In keeping with the tradition of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, several service projects were undertaken. One of the Chapter's original service projects was a scholarship, which was awarded to a deserving high school student. This project has continued and is now named the Thelma Gibbs Walker Scholarship. It continues to be a monetary scholarship given to a student transitioning to college. Gamma Kappa Omega has funded this effort with fund raisers and the support of community donations.

In 1952, Lucille Walker and Jenolar Hillsman McBride chartered Delta Beta, an undergraduate chapter located on the campus of Southern Illinois University in Carbondale. Gamma Kappa Omega serves as the sponsoring chapter to Delta Beta who will celebrate 64 years of service on April 19, 2016.

In recent years, Gamma Kappa Omega Chapter has sponsored health fairs, forums, community appreciation receptions, public meetings, math and science fairs, and financial planning workshops. Some of the entertainment brought to Carbondale by the Chapter includes "Having Our Say," the story of the Delaney sisters, Ebony Fashion Fair, and the Urban Bush Women. Other Chapter activities and events include the Preservation Hall Jazz Band, the acclaimed Boys Choir of Harlem, and Three Mo' Tenors. The Chapter, via its international programs, continues to provide educational enhancement, social etiquette and self-esteem building activities serving young girls from elementary through high school. Chapter members are frequently featured in the local newspaper and on the local network for their contributions to the community.

The contributions and activities of Gamma Kappa Omega are in keeping with the mission of the sorority's International Program, Launching New Dimensions of Service, to promote SERVICE TO ALL MANKIND.

"A Legacy of Sisterhood and Service Since 1908"

An Overview

Confined to what she called "a small circumscribed life" in the segregated and maledominated milieu that characterized the early 1900s, Howard University co-ed Ethel Hedgeman dreamed of creating a support network for women with like minds coming together for mutual uplift, and coalescing their talents and strengths for the benefit of others. In 1908, her vision crystallized as Alpha Kappa Alpha, the first Negro Greekletter sorority. Five years later (1913), lead incorporator Nellie Quander ensured Alpha Kappa Alpha's perpetuity through incorporation in the District of Columbia.

Together with eight other coeds at the mecca for Negro education, Hedgeman crafted a design that not only fostered interaction, stimulation, and ethical growth among members; but also provided hope for the masses. From the core group of nine at Howard, AKA has grown into a force of more than 283,000 collegiate members and alumnae, constituting 992 chapters in 42 states, the District of Columbia, the US Virgin Islands, the Bahamas, Germany, Liberia, South Korea, Japan, Canada, and South Africa.

Because they believed that Negro college women represented "the highest—more education, more enlightenment, and more of almost everything that the great mass of Negroes never had" — Hedgeman and her cohorts worked to honor what she called "an everlasting debt to raise them (Negroes) up and to make them better." For more than a century, the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sisterhood has fulfilled that obligation by becoming an indomitable force for good in their communities, state, nation, and the world. The Alpha Kappa Alpha program today still reflects the communal consciousness steeped in the AKA tradition and embodied in AKA's credo, "To be supreme in service to all mankind." Cultural awareness and social advocacy marked Alpha Kappa Alpha's infancy, but within one year (1914) of acquiring corporate status, AKA had also made its mark on education, establishing a scholarship award. The programming was a prelude to the thousands of pioneering and enduring initiatives that eventually defined the Alpha Kappa Alpha brand.

Through the years, Alpha Kappa Alpha has used the Sisterhood as a grand lever to raise the status of African-Americans, particularly girls and women. AKA has enriched minds and encouraged life-long learning; provided aid for the poor, the sick, and underserved; initiated social action to advance human and civil rights; worked collaboratively with other groups to maximize outreach on progressive endeavors; and continually produced leaders to continue its credo of service.

Guided by twenty-nine international presidents from Nellie M. Quander (1913-1919) to Dorothy Buckhanan Wilson (2014-2018), with reinforcement from a professional headquarters staff since 1949, AKA's corps of volunteers has instituted groundbreaking social action initiatives and social service programs that have transformed communities for the better—continually emitting progress in cities, states, the nation, and the world.

Thelma Gibbs Walker Scholarship

History

Since 1983, Gamma Kappa Omega Chapter has contributed to the financial success of college-bound high school seniors with scholarships. Selection is based on academic achievement, financial need, community involvement and participation in extra-curricular school activities. In March 2003, for the 20th anniversary of the chapter's scholarship fund, and in commemoration of the chapter's 62nd Founders' Day, its annual scholarship was renamed to honor



Thelma Gibbs Walker. She gave untiringly to the community as an educator, a civic leader, and a businesswoman, and has always been held in highest esteem. She was a lifetime member and the last surviving charter member of Gamma Kappa Omega.

On March 15, 1941, Gamma Kappa Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, was chartered in Carbondale, Illinois. Eleven courageous and visionary young women, Gwendolyn Chambliss, Luella McCall Davis, Mildred Kedley, Grace Perkins Kelley, Jenolar Hillsman Mcbride, Lovia Bell Penn, Dorenda Taylor, Lucille Walker, Thelma Gibbs Walker, Versa Hayes Whites and Velma Woods were the charter members.

Pastors Doug & Lisa Cherry



Pastor Doug Cherry, in partnership with his wife, Lisa, founded Victory Christian Center of southern Illinois in November of 1998 in their home. Their vision has been to build and strengthen families starting in Southern Illinois and moving worldwide. In preparation for building their ministry, Doug and Lisa trained for five years at Oral Roberts University and Victory Christian Center in Tulsa, Oklahoma under the direction of Pastors Billy Joe and Sharon Daugherty. At the end of their studies they returned to their roots here in Carbondale and began their work. Today, Victory Christian Center is an active

facility at 607 E. College Street, the former city hall building. It houses numerous ministries, with the Food Pantry and REALITY Youth Center among those used in southern Illinois. The Food Pantry has distributed 2,500,000 pounds of food since 2010. Every month the pantry feeds 900 families and 3,000 individuals. The REALITY Youth Center is a coalition of young people sounding the Battle Cry for the hearts and souls of children, teens and young adults of our nation.

Doug and Lisa are the parents of ten children and six grandchildren. Their son, Nathan, serves as associate pastor and Director of REALITY Youth Center. And their son Lucas assists with the center's operation as sound technician and youth leader.

After receiving a Bachelor's Degree in Recreation Administration from SIUC in 1986, Mr. Osborn worked in youth services with Park Districts, and in social service camp and education programs for inner-city Chicago families, and for people with disabilities from southern Illinois. In 2004, he became the first Executive Director of the Boys & Girls Club of Carbondale. In 2015, the Club attracted over 1000 members, and now operates four afterschool sites—three of which are in Carbondale public schools.

Jackson Funeral Home



The Jackson Funeral Home, founded in 1905, by the late Frank B. Jackson and his wife Etta Waddell Jackson, is the oldest black funeral home in downstate Illinois. Mr. Jackson was well known for his civic activities, his membership in fraternal organizations and his loyal support of his church, the Olivet Freewill Baptist Church of Carbondale. The Jackson Funeral Home is known for its friendly, courteous and sympathetic services and has conducted services for many of the area's most prominent citizens.

The late Etta Jackson would often share many interesting stories of the early days of the funeral home. Their first hearse was pulled by two white horses and she would relate the difficulty in climbing the snowy and icy hills leading to Murphysboro Tower Grove Cemetery. Unlike her white competitors and other black funeral establishments, Mrs. Jackson was well-known for her leniency in payment of overdue bills. Many funeral bills went unpaid. She related how one man, intoxicated and ridden with guilt, came by to pay his mother's funeral bill which was twenty years old.

In December, 1949, Mr. Frank B. Jackson went to his eternal rest. Mrs. Etta Jackson continued to run the business with the assistance of Mr. John E. Jones, until his death in 1964.

Mr. James H. (Judd) Walker, who was a co-owner at that time, acquired the Funeral I Home in 1974. Mr. Walker felt the Jacksons made an important contribution to Carbondale history and for this reason the business was still called the Jackson Funeral Home and will always be so. He held Mother Jackson in high esteem and she continued to take an active role in the business until her health no longer allowed. Mrs. Thelma Gibbs Walker continued to carry the banner of high quality service in the Etta Jackson tradition.

The area came to love Mr. and Mrs. Walker and held them in the highest regard. Both Mr. and Mrs. Walker were very active in church, civic, and community organizations. The Jackson Funeral Home offered high quality service at the most economical price of any funeral home in the southern region of the state.

With the very sparse number of black businesses in downstate Illinois, we can be proud of a firm that has served our region for nearly a century.

Mrs. Thelma G. Walker went to her eternal rest in April, 2006 and Mr. James (Judd) Walker went to his eternal rest in November, 2011. The present owner, Larry D. "Mike" Walton, now continues the tradition set forth by the Jacksons and Walkers.


