Greek Sisterhood Forum



For a third year, members of the four Divine 9 Greek-letter sororities came together to celebrate sisterhood in an enlightening session where they delved into the myth of the "Strong Black Woman Syndrome:

Leading the discussion was Dr. Marquitta Bowman, assistant director of CAPS, Director of Training, at Southern Illiois University.

Dr. Bowman talked about the mental health needs of Black women, noting that African American women are 2.4 percent more likely to report feeling sad and 5.8 percent more likely to experience postpartum depression.



BLACK MATERNAL HEALTH WEEK

April 11th - 17th, 2022

In 2020, 861 women were identified as having died of maternal causes in the United States, compared with 754 in 2019.

- According to the CDC

In 2020, the maternal mortality rate for Black women was 55.3 deaths per 100,000 live births. This is 2.9x more than White women.



Stress Awareness Month happens each April. It's important to learn some strategies for coping with this particular silent scourge. Learning to cope with our stress and finding healthy ways to deal with these situations can go a long way in living a healthy and positive life.

- Exercise. You've probably heard this one before, and even though it's probably not
 exactly what you want to do when you're feeling stressed (because laying on the couch
 and watching movies sounds more appealing), exercising gets endorphins pumping
 through your brain, which triggers a happy feeling. Exercise lowers your body's stress
 hormones like cortisol, and releases chemicals that make you feel more at peace.
- 2. Think about taking **natural supplements** to help you feel more at ease. Natural remedies like lemon balm, omega-3 fatty acids, ashwagandha, green tea, and essential oils are very helpful.
- 3. **Light a candle or turn on the oil diffusers**, put on some soft, soothing **music** and **dim the lights**. Take a **deep breath** and count your blessings.
- 4. **Caffeine intake reduction** can help (even though it's tough to kick the coffee!) because caffeine tends to make us jittery, which can cause stress and anxiety.
- 5. **Spend time laughing with friends and family**. Let yourself have a good time and get your mind off the busyness of the real world.






